# **2-DAYS TSAVO EAST AND SATAO CAMP**

## **TSAVO EAST NATIONAL PARK**

The combined areas of Tsavo East and West National Parks covering some 4% of Kenya's total land area (the size of Wales) makes Tsavo one of the world's largest game sanctuaries. Situated halfway between Nairobi and Mombasa, the Park is a haven for a diverse cross-section of wildlife including the 'Big Five'.

Tsavo East lies to the East of the Nairobi-Mombasa highway. This park is mainly a vast plain of bushland dotted with the bizarre shapes of monstrous Baobab trees. The Galana River flows through this park, bringing life giving water to the resident animal population.

Large herds of 'red' elephants are a characteristic sight – 'red' due to the coloured dust they throw over themselves. Tsavo's Game is wild and long distances are covered in this park but it is one of Kenya great wilderness areas.

- 13:00 Lunch at Satao Camp

Each tent, is furnished to the highest standard, with deluxe beds, writing desk and mini-bar, slate-built en-suite bathroom with shower, and verandah overlooking the spectacular countryside. Set around a series of freshwater pools, where guests can enjoy closeness to game in its natural habitat, the site plays host to hippos and crocodiles and is often visited by other animals. The superb facilities include dining room, lounge and bar, terrace overlooking a hippo pool and swimming pool.

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## LAMU

Lamu is 45 minutes flying time from Malindi, the flight along the Coast is an experience. Lamu town was established on its present site in the 14<sup>th</sup> Century, but there had been people living on the Island for a much longer time. The port of Lamu was an important trading centre in the 18<sup>th</sup> Century but lost its position to Mombasa. Now you can find one of the last remnants of Swahili civilization.

Lamu town itself is fascinating and a stroll through the old street is a must with no monuments, but hundred of ancient houses. The Museum is not to be missed and very few towns in Africa have kept their original town plans intact. Lamu's Shella Beach is spectacular.

## 2 – DAYS MASAI MARA

### THE MASAI MARA

The main highlight of many safaris is the world-famous Masai Mara, the northern extension of the Serengeti plains of Tanzania. Rich in wildlife and rolling landscapes, the Masai Mara presents one of the greatest wildlife theatres on earth. Sightings of lion and cheetah, permanent residents of the Mara, are common. The most spectacular time to visit is during the annual migration season, normally July to October depending on the rains. Over a million animals including Zebras and Wildebeest, head down from the Masai Mara to the Serengeti in search of fresh pastures. To get an overview there is no better way of adding to the thrill of safari than taking to the air in an exciting balloon safari. The hot-air balloon sets off at dawn and slowly rises above the plains offering a bird's-eye view of the game.
